Coronavirus

A reminder to parents/carers to minimise waiting at the school gates and please continue, unless exempt, to wear face coverings at drop off/pick times, in line with Scottish Government guidance.

The Council Executive have agreed to continue the provision of paying £3 per day to families in receipt of clothing grant (P1-P4) and Free School Meals (P5-S6) if they have a child who is required to isolate due to Covid-19 guidance and is absent from school.

The criteria is set out below for parents/carers

- P1 to P4 pupil and recently received a school clothing grant.
- P5 to S6 and be in receipt of free school meals.
- The information you provide will be cross referenced with pupil school attendance records.
- Payment will be made to the bank account you notified us of in your recent meals/clothing application (this can be updated at the end of the form if required).
- You will be required to complete one form per child for each period of isolation.

Parents/carers can retrospectively access this support from the beginning of the session if their child(ren) has been required to isolate and been absent from school

Hedgehog Update at Harrysmuir



Over the last two weeks our P4 - P7 hedgehog champions carried out a hedgehog survey to see whether we had any hedgehogs in the school grounds. They did this by setting up a tunnel that had some charcoal paste, white paper and a bit of dog food in it. The idea being that if a hedgehog walked through the tunnel across the charcoal, to get to the food, they would leave footprints. We are very excited to say that we did find hedgehog footprints and by using a motion camera we managed to record footage of the hedgehog too.

How can you encourage hedgehogs in our community?

Here are 10 tips.

- Link your garden Hedgehogs can roam from 1 - 2km each night. 13 x 13cm holes in fences and walls enable them to move from garden to garden.
- Make your pond safe Hedgehogs can swim but can't climb out of steep sided ponds, using a pile of stone or piece of wood will enable them to climb out.
- 3. Create a wild corner leave a corner to grow wild this can provide a nest area and insects to feed the hedgehog.
- Deal with litter and netting Hedgehogs are prone to getting tangled in netting. Polystyrene cups, plastic and elastic bands can also cause problems.
- Put out food and water Hedgehogs really benefit from extra food, using it as a supplement to their natural diet. Meaty cat or dog food and hedgehog food are both suitable.
- 6. Stop using chemicals Lawn treatments reduce worm populations. Pesticides, insecticides and slug pellets are toxic and reduce hedgehogs' creepy crawly prey.
- Check before strimming Hedgehogs will not run away from the sound of a mower or strimmer.
- 8. Be careful with bonfires Piles of debris are irresistible to a hedgehog looking for somewhere to hibernate or nest build it on

- the day of burning or move the pile on the day of burning to avoid a tragic end.
- 9. Making a home for hedgehogs A log pile is one of the best features for encouraging all kinds of wildlife - and so easy to make. It will encourage insects and provide nesting opportunities all year around.
- 10. Become a hedgehog champion Register on Hedgehog Street and join our army of over 60,000 volunteers. We'll provide you with all of the resources you could need to make your neighbourhood chock-a-block with hedgehogs. www.hedgehogstreet.org
